I have been part of the FIL and now World Lacrosse for over eleven years, first as the Chair of Men's Officiating, and for the last two years as the FIL's Technical Director. In that time, I have overseen the phenomenal growth of the game with the panel of officials expanding from twenty-three to near one hundred and a support team exceeding twenty at our World Championship. Ensuring that we have the right approach, metrics, policies and governance has been key to facilitate and support this expansion. During my tenure, working across the game I have worked with the many committees within the technical portfolio to modernize the game, ensuring that it continues to meet the demands of the members and the needs of the player. My appointment of the first Education and Training Chair has allowed World Lacrosse to begin to look at effective education programmes to understand how we can impact the education of officials around the world.

I have led initiatives to harmonize and further develop a cohesive officiating and rules programme across all domains. We have developed a comprehensive competency-based framework that will help officials progress along the Officiating Pathway as they continue to grow into international officials. We appointed our first Chief Medical Officer who is now leading our review of player injuries to ensure that we can provide a safe playing environment and continues to contribute to the development of rules and policies to ensure this.

I continue to evolve our commitment to clean sport through the leadership of our Anti-Doping programme including the introduction of mandatory education for competing athletes and soon the introduction of an education programme for our members. I work with our staff to ensure we remain compliant and continue to work with our partners including WADA and other international federations to ensure that World Lacrosse remains a clean sport.

I have a passion for sport but understand that passion alone is not enough. I have strong business acumen and for the past two years I have significantly contributed at the Board level through effective leadership and working with fellow Board members and colleagues throughout the organisation to identify and deliver ways of improving the sport's effectiveness and growth around the world. I have worked on sub-committees to hire staff, data compliance, or to review digital strategies that help World Lacrosse as we become a world leading sporting organisation.

I know that I can continue to make a significant and lasting contribution to World Lacrosse in the continually shifting international sporting landscape. I would welcome the opportunity to further expand on my experience and look forward to speaking with the membership.
