2 Officials Costs

Men Competing teams share the accommodation and food costs (3 meals) for all the Officials plus the transportation cost to the event for the Referee -in - Chief and one Deputy Referee - in - Chief (providing that the Deputy is the appointed R-i-C of the next Men's world event)

The Officials, or their National Governing Body (NGB), are responsible for the transportation costs to the event including from the airport to the accommodation location.

Women Competing teams share the transportation costs for all Officials to the event airport / train station etc.) ~~plus the costs of the final dinner / banquet.~~ Note: Agreed at GA2014 that the dinner /banquet was no longer mandatory

It is the responsibility of the host country to provide athletic trainer / physiotherapist care for the Umpires. This is a shared cost among the competing teams.

The host Organising Committee (OC) is responsible for the transportation costs for Officials (umpires and TDs) to and from the arrival/departure point (usually airport) to the accommodation location

The host Organising Committee (OC) is responsible for paying for the accommodation of all Officials (umpires and TDs) and two meals per day. Other meals are the responsibility of the Officials

For both men and women's events the Officials are responsible for their own uniform costs (generally sponsorship is obtained)

Note: The 2016 General Assembly directed that the cost of Officials borne by the hosts is reduced and the same arrangements are in place for both men's and women's events by 2021.

Receptions / Ceremonies **

At Women's events the host Organising Committee (OC) is responsible for the transportation costs for all teams and FIL Board (and Chairs) from the arrival point (usually airport) to the accommodation location. Return cost from the accommodation to the departure point is the responsibility of teams. (changed at GA2014).
Ice baths no longer a host responsibility to provide (GA2014).

FIL hosts up to two receptions at each event, normally there would only be a second reception if the event is co-incident with a General Assembly (with the second primarily for GA Delegates).
