





OLYMPICS // LA28

PLANNING + DELIVERY

- Venue: Exposition Park Stadium (BMO Stadium - LAFC)
- Quotas: 6 teams per gender, 11 athletes per team
- Competition Format: 5 days of round robin + 1 day of medals
- Schedule: June 24-28: 2 sessions of 3 round robin games
June 29: 2 sessions of 2 medal games
- Lacrosse Sport Manager: Jeff Steffen
- Other: Event Venue Brief development, accommodation request
- Planning Meetings: IF Transition Seminar (January),
official IF site visit (November), ORIS workshop (November)



OLYMPICS // LA28

QUALIFICATION

- Qualification structure drafted by WL in close coordination with the IOC, with input and endorsement from the WL Competition Committee
- Member webinars on November 12 - no adverse feedback
- To be finalized with IOC staff by next month for final approval at the IOC Executive Board meeting in late January/early February 2026

- Two-stage approach; now to be informed by the IOC's new Fit for the Future process
- Brisbane 2032 in process of evaluating all relevant IFs through December 31, 2025
- Brisbane 2032 may select IFs from this analysis, if so, selected sports will be invited to present a formal submission for inclusion in early 2026
- Submissions will be reviewed and analyzed by Brisbane 2032 and any sports recommended for inclusion will be submitted to the IOC for nomination by mid-2026
- Sports nominated to the IOC will go to the IOC Programme Commission, IOC Executive Board, and finally, the IOC Session in late 2026 for confirmation

REVENUE GENERATION // PARTNERSHIPS

PLATFORM DEVELOPMENT: Developing and refining a sponsorship asset portfolio and actively introducing WL's partnership platform to major global brands aligned with WL athletes, fans and values

NEW PARTNERS: Secured new category partnerships including an official ticketing and hospitality provider, a printing and signage partner and the Official Ball of World Lacrosse (all to be officially announced soon)

EQUIPMENT ALLIANCE: Building the WL Equipment Manufacturers Alliance (slated to launch in 2026) with leading endemic brands to strengthen supply relationships and global access to equipment

REVENUE GENERATION // FUNDRAISING



Advancing plans to establish the World Lacrosse Foundation, a dedicated 501(c)(3) philanthropic entity designed to generate sustainable revenue and advance WL's mission

- Developing core infrastructure including governance documents, board recruitment and implementation of essential tools and technologies
- Exploring the feasibility of a global fundraising campaign that leverages the excitement of Olympic inclusion to galvanize support and resources for the sport's continued worldwide growth


